Individuals may have been hesitant to start something new or add to an already full plate. However, South Georgia Technical College’s faculty, staff, and administration have stepped up and done what was necessary to ensure that when an individual was ready to take that first step, we were here to help propel individuals towards the career of a lifetime.

I am thankful for the people who make this happen and I am very humbled to be a part of communities filled with individuals and business and industry leaders who support South Georgia Technical College and our mission of workforce education.

Even with the challenges of the coronavirus, South Georgia Technical College has been successful. South Georgia Technical College was chosen as the top Community College in Georgia for the third consecutive year by Niche.com. Niche assessed nearly 1000 colleges across the nation based on statistics such as: academics, average loan amount,

alumni earnings, student surveys regarding value and professor quality, awards won by faculty, student-faculty ratio, retention and graduation rates, and overall student experience.

South Georgia Technical College also was selected by the Aspen Institute as one of only 150 institutions from across the nation eligible to compete for the \$1 million Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence, the nation’s signature recognition of high achievement and performance among America’s community colleges. There are over 1,000 community colleges nation-wide.

And while other colleges were having trouble retaining students, South Georgia Technical College was ranked 11th best in the nation in graduation rates by the Chronicle of Higher Education. South Georgia Technical College was the 11th best two-year public college in the nation for graduation rates of first-time, full-time, degree or certificate seeking students who entered and completed an associate degree or earned a certificate at the same institution within 150 percent of the normal time to complete for that program. In addition to that number, South Georgia Technical College also had a 100% job placement rating for graduates.

One special group that excelled during this pandemic was South Georgia Technical College’s practical nursing students from both the Americus and the Crisp County Center. This group achieved a 100% pass rate for the 2021 National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). And these individuals now are employed in our communities. It is very difficult to achieve the elusive mark of 100% pass rate in the very best of circumstances but to accomplish this during the unprecedented stress on healthcare systems is a remarkable achievement. They chose to take the first step toward getting ahead.

South Georgia Technical College has added new instructors for the Aviation Maintenance, Commercial Truck Driving, Computer Information Systems, Horticulture, and general core programs. These new positions were created to help provide the services needed to help students continue to be successful in their career ambitions.

For many people, the past two years may have resulted in isolation, feelings of being disconnected or restlessness. Maybe the connective tissue that is a result of positive relationships and just being together has frayed. South Georgia Technical College is doing our part to help bring that to an end.

Just recently, the SGTC faculty and staff banded together to host the second annual Drive-Thru “Light Up Your Future” celebration for the community in an attempt to share the different opportunities available here while giving back to the community through a celebration of lights and a spirit of encouragement. Over 1000 individuals drove through the SGTC campus for this event. They made the decision to “Move Forward.”

At South Georgia Technical College, I hope we always make decisions to positively impact our community and our students. What decisions are YOU making now as we enter the new year that will change your life and the lives of others tomorrow? If you decide to take that first step toward getting ahead, I hope you choose South Georgia Technical College.

Eligible students enrolled in these specific programs taking 3-8 hours qualify for \$250 per semester and those enrolled in 1-2 hours can receive an additional \$125 per semester.

Verification of Lawful Presence in the United States

Effective January 1, 2012, all students applying for in-state tuition must provide validation of lawful presence in the United States. The following documents will serve as proof of lawful presence in the United States and documentation will be required before you are eligible for consideration of in-state tuition:

- A current Driver's License issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current ID issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current Driver's License or ID issued by a state that verifies immigration status and only issues to persons lawfully present in the United States.

The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) will accept the following:

- **Alabama:** Issued after August 1, 2000
- **Florida:** Issued after January 1, 2010 AND have a gold star in the upper right hand corner.
- **South Carolina:** Issued after November 1, 2008
- **Tennessee:** Issued after May 29, 2004.
- A certified U.S. Birth Certificate showing the student was born in the U.S. or a U.S. territory. A photocopy is not acceptable.
- An approved completed FAFSA for the current financial aid year.
- A current, valid Permanent Resident Card (USCIS form 1-151 or 1-551).
- A current, valid military identification card for active duty soldiers or veterans.
- A U.S. Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State (DS-1350) or a Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240).
- A current U.S. Passport.
- A U.S. Certificate of Citizenship (USCIS form N-560 or N-561).
- A U.S. Certificate of Naturalization (USCIS form N-550 or N-570).

Any student who cannot be verified as lawfully present in the United States is not eligible to be considered for in-state tuition, regardless of how long he or she has lived in Georgia. In addition to being lawfully present in the United States, students must meet the in-state tuition requirements as outlined in TCSG Board Policy and Procedure V.B.3 to warrant an in-state classification. Students that are initially classified as out-of-state and successfully petition to have their residency changed to in-state also have to meet the verification requirement.

Complete the 2021-2022 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and apply now!

GATHER THE INFORMATION

- Make sure you have filed your 2019 tax return.
- In most cases, you can use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool when you are completing the FAFSA to download your tax information directly from the IRS into the FAFSA.
- Value of assets, investments, businesses, investment farms, cash, savings, and checking
- Amount of untaxed income i.e. W-2s for non-tax filers, TANF, SNAP, SSI, Child Support, etc...
- Social Security Number and Birth Date
- Marital Status

APPLY NOW!!

- Complete the 2021-2022 FAFSA online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Apply as soon as

possible so the Financial Aid Office has sufficient time to process your application. A completed application (student aid report and any documents requested for verification) is required to award financial aid. South Georgia Tech's school code is 005617.

- It is faster to sign the FAFSA electronically Apply at FSAid.ed.gov

FOLLOW UP ON ANY CORRESPONDENCE FROM SGTC

- You may be selected for verification by the federal processor. If so, you will receive an email requesting needed documents.
- Please submit any documents requested by the college as soon as possible to avoid delays in awarding financial aid.

How to obtain your tax transcript:

Students who are selected for verification and chose not to use or were unable to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool will need to provide for the student and the parent/spouse, if necessary. 1040 Tax Forms are not accepted. Tax Transcripts come directly from the IRS and may take 5-10 business days to receive.

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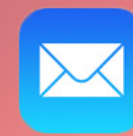

South Georgia Technical College has earned the top spot as the Best Community College in Georgia for 2022 by Niche, announced SGTC President Dr. John Watford. This is the third consecutive year that South Georgia Tech has earned this distinction. In addition to being named the Best Community College in Georgia for the third consecutive year, SGTC was also listed as the 48th best community college in America. A total of 845 colleges in the U.S. were reviewed by Niche.com for these rankings. The SGTC Culinary Arts program also ranked 34th in the nation.

"South Georgia Technical College has a tremendous reputation for providing an outstanding two-year education that prepares students for the workforce," said South Georgia Technical College President Dr. John Watford. "We are very pleased that Niche has ranked us as the number one community college in Georgia for three consecutive years. This provides external validation about the quality and excellence in technical education that we provide."

Dr. Watford gave credit to the community as well as the faculty, staff, and students at South Georgia Technical College. "This ranking is a testament to the faculty, staff and students at South Georgia Technical College and to our business and industry partners. Students attend South Georgia Technical College because of the outstanding faculty and staff here who continuously work for the betterment of students. Our professionals are helping students enroll, remain in classes, and become educated and trained for the careers of their choice. Niche is a website that rigorously analyzes dozens of public data sets and millions of reviews to produce comprehensive rankings, report cards, and profiles for every K-12 school, college and neighborhood in the U.S. Niche has over 100 million reviews and poll responses with transparent statistics needed to help find the right college or school for individuals.

Niche assessed 1,223 colleges. For the purpose of this ranking, community colleges include public post-secondary institutions where the majority of the degrees conferred are two-year or fewer. Statistics were obtained from the U.S. Department of Education.

The factors considered for the ranking included statistics such as: academics, average loan amount, alumni earnings, student surveys regarding value, awards won by faculty, student-faculty ratio, student surveys regarding professor quality, grades including retention and graduation rates, and overall student experience. The Georgia Institute of Technology (Georgia Tech), Emory University, the University of Georgia, Mercer University and Agnes Scott College topped the list for the four-year colleges and universities. The state of Georgia is home to more than 60 colleges and universities, including 30 schools under the University System of Georgia (USG), and 22 schools within the state's technical college system. There are also a number of private and for-profit colleges operating in the state.



FEDERAL PELL GRANT

Amount: Depending on need analysis and enrollment status, amount ranges up to \$3248 per semester and may not exceed \$9744 for the award year. Pell award may be divided among fall, spring, and summer semesters.

Eligibility: A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U. S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. Student must also have a High School Diploma or GED.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY JOB

Amount: Dependent upon availability of funds and hours worked.

Eligibility: Student must be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant and complete a Work Study Application. Student must be selected for employment.

GEORGIA HOPE GRANT

Amount: The HOPE Grant will cover \$76 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service. Students must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA after their first 30 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours and again after 60 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours to remain eligible for HOPE Grant.

GEORGIA HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The HOPE Scholarship will cover \$76 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. Student must complete an Institutional Application for HOPE Scholarship. First-time applicants may only receive HOPE Scholarship during the first seven years after they graduate from high school or attain their GED. Student must be a final HOPE Scholar from an eligible high school or have maintained a "B" average after the college semester in which you have attempted 30 semester hours of degree credit. Applicants must not have earned a bachelor's degree or have attempted more than 127 semester hours of college credit. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service.

ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Scholarship will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Scholarship requirements, student must have graduated from an eligible high school with a 3.7 GPA and an SAT score of 1200 or student must have graduated as a valedictorian or salutatorian while meeting all HOPE Scholarship eligibility requirements.

ZELL MILLER GRANT

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Grant will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students, and \$125 per semester credit hour for Commercial Truck Driving and \$100 per semester credit hour for Basic Law Enforcement.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Grant requirements, student have a minimum of 3.5 cumulative GPA in postsecondary classes. There is no high school GPA requirement. Students who earn a 3.5 or better at the end of their first semester will be eligible for the Zell Miller Grant their second semester. Students must maintain a minimum 3.5 GPA at the end of each subsequent semester to continue to qualify.

How to Apply for Admission to South Georgia Technical College

1. Submit a completed application, along with a one-time \$25 non-refundable application fee.
2. Provide official high school/GED/college transcript(s).
3. Provide proof of residency and picture ID.
4. *Schedule an appointment to take the Accuplacer placement exam if needed.
5. Apply for Financial Aid (HOPE and Pell).
6. Receive acceptance letter and final instructions from SGTC Admissions Office.

*The placement exam is designed to determine the applicant's reading, writing and math skills in order to guide the student in educational and career decisions. It is not designed to be a hindrance or barrier to enrollment in a program. **Exceptions in lieu of the placement exam are:**
