The term "going the extra mile" is an old expression. It describes those who do more than is expected, who try a bit harder and who go above and beyond the norm. South Georgia Technical College is always striving to "go the extra mile" for students, business and industry, and the communities we serve.

South Georgia Technical College has been ranked as the Best Community College in Georgia for three consecutive years, has lifetime job placement assistance for graduates and features over 30 programs that are available nearly tuition free to HOPE grant eligible students.

South Georgia Technical College also provides individuals with the opportunity to enroll in over 200 associate degree, diploma, or technical certificates of credit program offerings. SGTC has a 99% job placement rate for graduates and offers students and employers a guarantee that "if one of our graduates, who was educated under a standard program, and his or her employer agree that the employee is deficient in one or more competencies as defined in the standards, South Georgia Technical College will retrain that employee at no instructional cost to the employee or the employer."

Those are just a few examples of how South Georgia Technical College and its faculty and staff strive to "go the extra mile" for students and the public. Our focus is on providing something extra for students. SGTC offers students

the use of textbooks at no cost, provides on-campus housing and nationally ranked academics, student activities, and intercollegiate athletics. It has the "Complete College Experience."

In addition to providing something extra, SGTC's faculty and staff take a personal interest in students and try to identify the best possible outcome for students whether it is in the classroom, on the basketball court, as part of student organizations, or when it comes to financial aid, admissions, campus life, academics, or additional support. We attempt to go above and beyond for the people who have entrusted us with their education and to the businesses and industries who allow us to provide them with a trained workforce.

Despite all of these opportunities to excel, there is currently a decline in students seeking education and training beyond high school. The Atlanta Journal Constitution published an article in its "Get Schooled" section recently that quoted Stephen L. Pruitt, President of the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB). He believes postsecondary education - anything past 12th grade - is the engine to recovery and right now, he is not seeing enough fuel in that engine.

Recent U.S. numbers from the National Student Clearinghouse Research Center showed that two-year college enrollment fell about 7% in SREB states between 2014 and 2019. In Georgia, the drop was 11.6%. South Georgia Technical College saw an increase in enrollment each of those years thanks to its "Going the Extra Mile" mentality.

However, the pandemic seems to have worsened the decline in two-year college enrollment. Georgia's economic growth and the communities where we live and work, depend on both workers with college degrees and those with training in the trades. Individuals need good solid educations that will lead to successful after-school life. The end goal after high school shouldn't be a college diploma for every student, but training and skills that enable every student to earn a livable wage. Students need to know they are just as valued if they go to a community college and get an associate's degree that leads to a great career.

Almost every SGTC graduate has a job or career option before graduation. They are nurses, receptionists, bookkeepers, entrepreneurs, air conditioning technicians, cosmetologists, EMT's, auto mechanics, auto collision and repair specialists, law enforcement officers, diesel mechanics, electricians, machinists, aviation maintenance technicians, computer specialists, firefighters, welders, culinary artists, drafters, early childhood care and education workers, marketers, business office specialists, and more. They are the "doers" in the community. They are the ones who "go the extra mile" to make our community work.

Our students are ranked among the best in the state and in the nation in their chosen career fields. SGTC's Jonathan Large was the top aviation maintenance technician in the state in the SkillsUSA competition and represented the college at the national competition. Kimberly Sadecki, an SGTC Criminal Justice student, won a gold medal in "Job Interview Skills." Sadecki also finished 3rd in the nation in that same competition at the SkillsUSA national event. Zakyah Cameron, a Culinary Arts student, represented the college as its Georgia Occupational Award of Leadership (GOAL) student in state competition and Staryln Sampson, Auto Collision and Repair Instructor, was recognized as among the best instructors in the state.

These are just a sampling of how South Georgia Technical College and its students are "going the extra mile" each semester and how the faculty and staff at South Georgia Technical College constantly work to encourage the individuals who entrust themselves and their educational options to this college.

Another reason we are able to "go the extra mile" is because of the support we receive from people like you. I thank you for your past support of this college and programs and ask for it again. The South Georgia Technical College Foundation's TechForce 2022 fund drive begins this fall. Eligible students enrolled in these specific programs taking 3-8 hours qualify for \$250 per semester and those enrolled in 1-2 hours can receive an additional \$125 per semester.

Verification of Lawful Presence in the United States

Effective January 1, 2012, all students applying for in-state tuition must provide validation of lawful presence in the United States. The following documents will serve as proof of lawful presence in the United States and documentation will be required before you are eligible for consideration of in-state tuition:

- A current Driver's License issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current ID issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current Driver's License or ID issued by a state that verifies immigration status and only issues to persons lawfully present in the United States.

The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) will accept the following:

- **Alabama:** Issued after August 1, 2000
- **Florida:** Issued after January 1, 2010 AND have a gold star in the upper right hand corner.
- **South Carolina:** Issued after November 1, 2008
- **Tennessee:** Issued after May 29, 2004.
- A certified U.S. Birth Certificate showing the student was born in the U.S. or a U.S. territory. A photocopy is not acceptable.
- An approved completed FAFSA for the current financial aid year.
- A current, valid Permanent Resident Card (USCIS form 1-151 or 1-551).
- A current, valid military identification card for active duty soldiers or veterans.
- A U.S. Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State (DS-1350) or a Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240).
- A current U.S. Passport.
- A U.S. Certificate of Citizenship (USCIS form N-560 or N-561).
- A U.S. Certificate of Naturalization (USCIS form N-550 or N-570).

Any student who cannot be verified as lawfully present in the United States is not eligible to be considered for in-state tuition, regardless of how long he or she has lived in Georgia. In addition to being lawfully present in the United States, students must meet the in-state tuition requirements as outlined in TCSG Board Policy and Procedure V.B.3 to warrant an in-state classification. Students that are initially classified as out-of-state and successfully petition to have their residency changed to in-state also have to meet the verification requirement.

Financial Aid Reminders for 2022-2023

Complete the 2022-2023 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and apply now!

GATHER THE INFORMATION

- Make sure you have filed your 2020 tax return.
- In most cases, you can use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool when you are completing the FAFSA to download your tax information directly from the IRS into the FAFSA.
- Value of assets, investments, businesses, investment farms, cash, savings, and checking
- Amount of untaxed income i.e. W-2s for non-tax filers, TANF, SNAP, SSI, Child Support, etc...
- Social Security Number and Birth Date
- Marital Status

APPLY NOW!!

- Complete the 2022-2023 FAFSA online at www.studentaid.gov. Apply as soon as

possible so the Financial Aid Office has sufficient time to process your application. A completed application (student aid report and any documents requested for verification) is required to award financial aid. South Georgia Tech's school code is 005617.

- It is faster to sign the FAFSA electronically Apply at FSAid.ed.gov

FOLLOW UP ON ANY CORRESPONDENCE FROM SGTC

- You may be selected for verification by the federal processor. If so, you will receive an email requesting needed documents.
- Please submit any documents requested by the college as soon as possible to avoid delays in awarding financial aid.

How to obtain your tax transcript:

Students who are selected for verification and chose not to use or were unable to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool will need to provide for the student and the parent/spouse, if necessary. 1040 Tax Forms are not accepted. Tax Transcripts come directly from the IRS and may take 5-10 business days to receive.

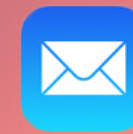

SGTC's Kimberly Sadecky Wins Bronze Medal At National SkillsUSA



South Georgia Technical College's Kimberly Sadecky of Montezuma took third place and a bronze medal in the 2022 National SkillsUSA Job Interview competition in Atlanta recently. She is a criminal justice student in Teresa McCook's program at South Georgia Technical College.

Sadecky and Jonathan Large of Marianna, FL, both captured gold medals at the State SkillsUSA competition earlier this year. As the best of the best in Georgia, Sadecky and Large earned the right to advance to the national competition against over 12,000 other top students. Sadecky competed in Job Interview and Large represented SGTC in the Aviation Maintenance competition.

Sarah Romanko of the University of Texas at Dallas took the Gold medal in the Job Interview event and Laura Franklin from Northeast State Community College was the Silver medal finalist ahead of Sadecky. In the Aviation Maintenance competition, Curtiss Gay of Penn College of Technology in Williamsport, PA; Kyle Wolner of the University of Alaska in Anchorage, AL, and Bryan Hunt of Jefferson Community & Technical College in Louisville, KY were the top three finishers.

SkillsUSA is a partnership of students, teachers and industry working together to ensure America has a skilled workforce. SkillsUSA helps each student excel. They provide educational programs, events, and competitions that support career and technical education in the nation's classrooms.

"South Georgia Technical College is very proud of both Kimberly Sadecky and Jonathan Large for the way they represented the college at the SkillsUSA national competition," said SGTC President Dr. John Watford. "SkillsUSA showcases the best technical education students in the nation. Our students shined in that national spotlight. I would like to thank both of them as well as their instructors and advisors for working so many hours to help them get prepared for the national competition. I congratulate them on their success."

Kimberly Sadecky was very appreciative of the opportunity to represent South Georgia Technical College at the SkillsUSA competition and she encouraged others to step out of their comfort zone and participate in the local, state, and national levels.

"This was an amazing experience," said Sadecky after she returned from the national competition in Atlanta with a bronze medal. "It was a very eye-opening experience and the competition was very intense. But I am so appreciative of the opportunity to participate in something like this. It has had a tremendous impact on my life."

Sadecky said that much of the credit for her success goes to her instructor Teresa McCook. "She encouraged me to participate and then she helped me select the competition category that she thought I would do well in. Then we went to work and I am very grateful for her guidance and support."

In the Job Interview category, each student had to complete a job application and resume. Once that was completed the students were interviewed by a panel of judges. The students were judged on appearance, clothing, posture, and responses to questions asked by the panel. The students also had to take a Skills Standard Assessment test with over 50 questions that was worth 25 points of their grade.

Sadecky believes that the SkillsUSA experience has helped her grow personally as well as professionally. "The state competition was geared more toward traditional job interview skills but at the national level, it was more about work ethics and professional development."

When asked about her experience at South Georgia Tech, Sadecky revealed that she would encourage others to step out of their comfort levels and look at coming or returning to college.

“I am a non-traditional college student because I already have a lot of life experience. But I could not have asked for a better place to get my education than South Georgia Technical College,” said Sadecky. I started last August and I will complete my Criminal Justice degree in a little over a year. During this past year, I was selected as a GOAL finalist, competed and won at the state and national SkillsUSA levels, was a Student of Excellence, member of the National Technical Honor Society, Student Ambassador and on the Orientation team. I would not change a thing.”

Sadecky says Georgia is an amazing state that supports education. “Students can attend a technical college at almost no cost and leave with a great career with no college debt. And we need technical college graduates to help bridge the workforce gap right here in Georgia.

“One of the speakers at the competition made a point that everyone competing was an entrepreneur. With the technical skills, they were demonstrating, they had the opportunity to become self-employed and successful. That is what technical education provides,” added Sadecky.

She also encouraged students to find their career passion and feed it. “There is so much that you can do and study at a technical college. If you are an artist, enrolled in auto collisions and learn how to do pin stripping and detailing on a car, try welding and be creative in metal, or sign up for drafting. The point is you can find your passion and also be able to make a good living.”

CONGRESSMAN BISHOP ANNOUNCES \$3,048,137 IN FEDERAL GRANTS FOR THREE TECHNICAL COLLEGES IN GEORGIA’S SECOND CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT

FEDERAL PELL GRANT

Amount: Depending on need analysis and enrollment status, amount ranges up to \$3,448 per semester and may not exceed \$10,344 for the award year. Pell award may be divided among fall, spring, and summer semesters.

Eligibility: A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U. S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. Student must also have a High School Diploma or GED.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY JOB

Amount: Dependent upon availability of funds and hours worked.

Eligibility: Student must be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant and complete a Work Study Application. Student must be selected for employment.

GEORGIA HOPE GRANT

Amount: The HOPE Grant will cover \$90 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service. Students must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA after their first 30 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours and again after 60 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours to remain eligible for HOPE Grant.

GEORGIA HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The HOPE Scholarship will cover \$90 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. Student must complete an Institutional Application for HOPE Scholarship. First-time applicants may only receive HOPE Scholarship during the first seven years after they graduate from high school or attain their GED. Student must be a final HOPE Scholar from an eligible high school or have maintained a "B" average after the college semester in which you have attempted 30 semester hours of degree credit. Applicants must not have earned a bachelor's degree or have attempted more than 127 semester hours of college credit. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service.

ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Scholarship will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Scholarship requirements, student must have graduated from an eligible high school with a 3.7 GPA and an SAT score of 1200 or student must have graduated as a valedictorian or salutatorian while meeting all HOPE Scholarship eligibility requirements.

ZELL MILLER GRANT

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Grant will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students, and \$125 per semester credit hour for Commercial Truck Driving and \$100 per semester credit hour for Basic Law Enforcement.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Grant requirements, student have a minimum of 3.5 cumulative GPA in postsecondary classes. There is no high school GPA requirement. Students who earn a 3.5 or better at the end of their first semester will be eligible for the Zell Miller Grant their second semester. Students must maintain a minimum 3.5 GPA at the end of each subsequent semester to continue to qualify.

GEORGIA COLLEGE COMPLETION GRANT

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service. Must be within 80% of earning their credential from the program they are enrolled in. Must have an outstanding balance for the term enrolled in and have exhausted all other financial aid opportunities. Must have high school diploma or GED. Must complete the 2022-2023 FAFSA. Lifetime maximum award is \$2500.

How to Apply for Admission to South Georgia Technical College

1. Submit a completed application, along with a one-time \$25 non-refundable application fee.
2. Provide official high school/GED/college transcript(s).
3. Provide proof of residency and picture ID.
4. *Schedule an appointment to take the Accuplacer placement exam if needed.
5. Apply for Financial Aid (HOPE and Pell).
6. Receive acceptance letter and final instructions from SGTC Admissions Office.

*The placement exam is designed to determine the applicant's reading, writing and math skills in order to guide the student in educational and career decisions. It is not designed to be a hindrance or barrier to enrollment in a program. **Exceptions in lieu of the placement exam are:**

Fall 2022 and Spring 2023 Admissions Update: ACCUPLACER testing requirements will be waived for applicants for the upcoming Fall 2022, Spring 2023 and Summer 2023. **Although the ACCUPLACER will be waived, students will be required to meet other criteria as listed herein. If applicants do not have requirements herein, above, we will review a student's high school transcript for appropriate College Placement Scores.
