Background Check Form

Recent troubling events have occurred on college campuses across the nation. Persons with past criminal backgrounds have moved into college residence halls without the college's knowledge. The laws of most states, including Georgia, do not require law enforcement officials to notify college officials when a convicted criminal (on probation or parole) enrolls. It seems reasonable that the college be informed when an applicant for housing has been arrested and/or convicted of a serious crime. Being arrested and/or convicted does not automatically exclude one from on-campus housing. However, those who have committed crimes which pose a threat to our residents' property or persons do not need to live on campus where they have easy access to college students and their belongings. A panel will review each situation. While crime is low at SGTC, we want to do everything in our power to insure our students' safety. Therefore, all on- campus applicants are required to complete the following. (Note: no student will be assigned a room until this form is submitted and approved)

Meningococcal ACWY vaccine can help protect against meningococcal disease caused by serogroups A, C, W, and Y. A different meningococcal vaccine is available that can help protect against serogroup B. Meningococcal disease can cause meningitis (infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord) and infections of the blood. Even when it is treated, meningococcal disease kills 10 to 15 infected people out of 100. And of those who survive, about 10 to 20 out of every 100 will suffer disabilities such as hearing loss, brain damage, kidney damage, loss of limbs, nervous system problems, or severe scars from skin grafts. Meningococcal disease is rare and has declined in the United States since the 1990s. However, it is a severe disease with a significant risk of death or lasting disabilities in people who get it.

South Georgia Technical College strives to provide a residential environment which is conducive to success both in the classroom and in campus life in general. To meet that goal, SGTC has established the following rules and regulations for students living in our residence halls.

- GENERAL CONDUCT: All residence students are expected to abide by residence life rules, policies, and procedures, the Student Handbook, and local ordinances, state laws, and federal laws. Residence rules may be updated from time-to-time and it is the responsibility of each student to remain informed about such changes. Students in violation of residence life rules/ policies may be subject to disciplinary action. Sanctions for violation of residence hall rules/policies range from verbal warning to eviction from the residence halls. students may be required to remove stereos, musical instruments, or other audio devices from their room if used in a manner that unreasonably disturbs other residents. Amplification devices are strictly prohibited. What constitutes an amplification device shall be determined by the AVP or Vice President of Student Affairs.
- PAYMENT OF CHARGES: The student agrees to pay all room and board fees and other properly billed charges at the time scheduled by SGTC. Failure to timely pay charges may cause the student to be removed from student housing.
- HEALTH AND SAFETY CHECK: Health and safety checks are completed at least once each semester. The purpose of these checks is to identify and resolve any potential facility or sanitation problems. During a health and safety check, an RA or other representative of SGTC will enter each room to check the condition. Residents are not required to be present at a health and safety check although it is preferred. Student Affairs staff reserves to the right to remove any leftover trash/food that poses a health and safety threat/violation from student's room.
- ENTERING ROOMS: SGTC reserves the right to the fullest extent permitted by the law to enter a room for the purpose(s) of safety, occupancy verification, facility improvements, conducting maintenance, to ensure compliance with the SGTC Code of Conduct, or health and safety checks, managing rooms in the event of an epidemic or emergency that jeopardizes the well-being of the occupant or other students, and/or maintaining a quiet environment where residents may sleep and study. Student rooms may be searched for legal cause by civil authorities.
- GUESTS AND VISITORS: Residents are responsible for the conduct of their guests and visitors. No overnight guests allowed, meaning resident or non-resident guests. Failure to comply with this rule may result in disciplinary action for the resident.
- RESIDENCE HALL MEETINGS: There will be at least one residence hall meeting per term. Students are required to attend all residence hall meetings that are designated MANDATORY by the Vice President of Student Affairs or his/her designee. Failure to attend a MANDATORY Residence Hall Meeting may result in disciplinary action.
- SMOKING AND TOBACCO USE REGULATIONS: Smoking and the use of tobacco in any form, including e-cigarettes regardless of tobacco content, is STRICTLY PROHIBITED on SGTC property including inside James/Martin Hall and any assigned rooms.
- ALCOHOL USE REGULATIONS: The use or possession of alcoholic beverages and/or beverages identified as non-alcoholic beer are STRICTLY PROHIBITED on SGTC property including inside James/Martin Hall and any assigned rooms.
- ASSIGNMENTS: SGTC reserves the right to make assignments, reassignments and temporary assignments as considered necessary. Room changes may not be made without the approval of the Vice President of Student Affairs.
- WEAPONS: Explosives, firearms or weapons, fireworks, and chemical related items are not permitted in the residence halls.
- ITEMS NOT PERMITTED: The use of hotplates, air fryers, incense, candles, space heaters, or any other items described in the SGTC Course Catalog/Student Handbook/Residence Life Handbook is strictly forbidden. SGTC reserves the right to remove and confiscate any unauthorized or dangerous electrical items.
- PETS: No pets allowed, with the exception of approved Emotional Support Animals (ESA) or Service Dogs.
- CHECK IN/OUT PROCEDURES: SGTC has policies regarding check-in, room changes, and check-outs. Failure to comply with these policies may result in fines, including but not limited to the forfeiture of the housing deposit. Students may not occupy the residence halls during breaks in the SGTC academic calendar, unless written permission is given by the Vice President of Student Affairs, which may include holidays. Residents will be given advance notice of the breaks when halls will be closed but should refer to the SGTC Academic Calendar for preparation.
- CONTRACT CANCELLATION: Should a housing student need to cancel their housing agreement early for the following reasons: Academic (withdrawal from school/active military) Medical (Significant change in medical situation) Financial (Significant change in financial circumstances) will be able to leave housing at a prorated amount and not forfeit the deposit. Students who need to leave for these reasons must get cancellation approval from Housing to get a prorated refund.

Housing Agreement:

Students who need leave for these reasons must get approval from Housing to get a prorated refund.

Students will be assigned a roommate, unless single-occupancy rates are paid.
