Eligible students enrolled in these specific programs taking 3-8 hours qualify for \$250 per semester and those enrolled in 1-2 hours can receive an additional \$125 per semester.

Verification of Lawful Presence in the United States

Effective January 1, 2012, all students applying for in-state tuition must provide validation of lawful presence in the United States. The following documents will serve as proof of lawful presence in the United States and documentation will be required before you are eligible for consideration of in-state tuition:

- A current Driver's License issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current ID issued by the State of Georgia after January 1, 2008.
- A current Driver's License or ID issued by a state that verifies immigration status and only issues to persons lawfully present in the United States.

The Technical College System of Georgia (TCSG) will accept the following:

- **Alabama:** Issued after August 1, 2000
- **Florida:** Issued after January 1, 2010 AND have a gold star in the upper right hand corner.
- **South Carolina:** Issued after November 1, 2008
- **Tennessee:** Issued after May 29, 2004.
- A certified U.S. Birth Certificate showing the student was born in the U.S. or a U.S. territory. A photocopy is not acceptable.
- An approved completed FAFSA for the current financial aid year.
- A current, valid Permanent Resident Card (USCIS form 1-151 or 1-551).
- A current, valid military identification card for active duty soldiers or veterans.
- A U.S. Certificate of Birth Abroad issued by the Department of State (DS-1350) or a Consular Report of Birth Abroad (FS-240).
- A current U.S. Passport.
- A U.S. Certificate of Citizenship (USCIS form N-560 or N-561).
- A U.S. Certificate of Naturalization (USCIS form N-550 or N-570).

Any student who cannot be verified as lawfully present in the United States is not eligible to be considered for in-state tuition, regardless of how long he or she has lived in Georgia. In addition to being lawfully present in the United States, students must meet the in-state tuition requirements as outlined in TCSG Board Policy and Procedure V.B.3 to warrant an in-state classification. Students that are initially classified as out-of-state and successfully petition to have their residency changed to in-state also have to meet the verification requirement.

Financial Aid Reminders for 2024-2025

Complete the 2024-2025 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and apply now!

GATHER THE INFORMATION

- Make sure you have filed your 2022 tax return.
- In most cases, you can use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool when you are completing the FAFSA to download your tax information directly from the IRS into the FAFSA.
- Value of assets, investments, businesses, investment farms, cash, savings, and checking
- Amount of untaxed income i.e. W-2s for non-tax filers, TANF, SNAP, SSI, Child Support, etc...
- Social Security Number and Birth Date
- Marital Status

APPLY NOW!!

- Complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA online at www.studentaid.gov. Apply as soon as

possible so the Financial Aid Office has sufficient time to process your application. A completed application (student aid report and any documents requested for verification) is required to award financial aid. South Georgia Tech's school code is 005617.

- It is faster to sign the FAFSA electronically Apply at FSAid.ed.gov

FOLLOW UP ON ANY CORRESPONDENCE FROM SGTC

- You may be selected for verification by the federal processor. If so, you will receive an email requesting needed documents.
- Please submit any documents requested by the college as soon as possible to avoid delays in awarding financial aid.

How to obtain your tax transcript:

Students who are selected for verification and chose not to use or were unable to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool will need to provide for the student and the parent/spouse, if necessary. 1040 Tax Forms are not accepted. Tax Transcripts come directly from the IRS and may take 5-10 business days to receive.

SGTC awarded the Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce (GBHCW) Nursing School Grant

South Georgia Technical College has been selected to receive the Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce (GBHCW) Nursing School Grant, announced SGTC President Dr. John Watford. The GBHCW Nursing School Grant is designed to support nursing schools with waitlists, provide more opportunities to enhance enrollment capacity and graduate more nurses to serve our communities.

“The funding from the Georgia Board of Healthcare Workforce comes at an opportune time for South Georgia Technical College,” said SGTC President Dr. John Watford. “While we continue to train our existing Practical Nursing students, the college is embarking on the application process for an LPN to RN Bridge program that will, not only provide tremendous new opportunities for LPN’s in the field, but also help Georgia bridge the gap presented by the severe nursing shortage.

“Even though we want to get students as quickly as possible from the classroom into the workforce, we dare not cut any corners in providing a rigorous curriculum that will produce a well-trained and knowledgeable graduate. The funding through the GBHCW grant will provide much-needed state-of-the-art equipment to enhance the robust program for our existing practical nursing students and for our future bridging students,” added Dr. Watford.

The GBHCW grant at South Georgia Technical College will be utilized to purchase equipment and materials to increase retention, graduation, and pass rates for South Georgia Technical College’s practical nursing program.

The college will purchase two Anatomage convertible 3D interactive Anatomy Learning tables. Students can visualize anatomy exactly as they would on a physical cadaver to provide for an unprecedented level of real anatomy accuracy. This virtual learning approach has been adopted by many of the world’s leading medical schools. SGTC will utilize this equipment on both the Americus and the Crisp County Center campuses.

South Georgia Technical College will also purchase reusable study materials, supplies and books for the LPN program and other materials for in-class instruction as well as the NCLEX testing preparation. These materials should assist the college in increasing the pass, retention, and graduation rates for the students in the three-semester practical nursing program on both campuses. SGTC serves a rural, low income student population that struggles to afford additional study enhancement materials.

This grant will allow South Georgia Technical College to “bridge the nursing gap” by increasing the number of practical nurses who serve in the rural service area and the nursing field as a whole.

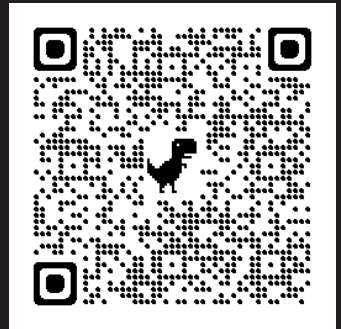
A total of \$3 million in grants was awarded by the Georgia Board of Health Care Workers.

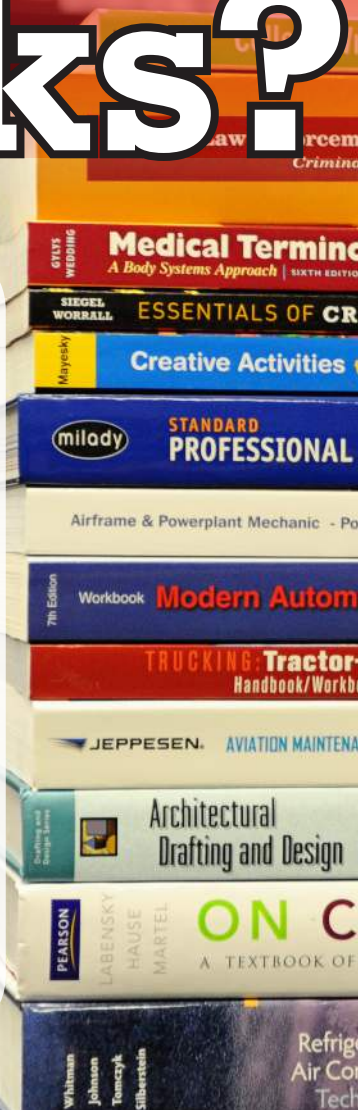

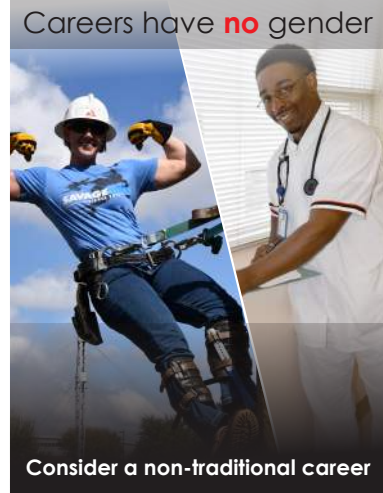

FEDERAL PELL GRANT

Amount: Depending on need analysis and enrollment status, amount ranges up to \$3,698 per semester and may not exceed \$11,094 for the award year. Pell award may be divided among fall, spring, and summer semesters.

Eligibility: A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U. S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. Student must also have a High School Diploma or GED.

FEDERAL WORK STUDY JOB

Amount: Dependent upon availability of funds and hours worked.

Eligibility: Student must be eligible for the Federal Pell Grant and complete a Work Study Application. Student must be selected for employment.

GEORGIA HOPE GRANT

Amount: The HOPE Grant will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service. Students must have a cumulative 2.0 GPA after their first 30 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours and again after 60 HOPE Grant Paid-Hours to remain eligible for HOPE Grant.

GEORGIA HOPE SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The HOPE Scholarship will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. First-time applicants may only receive HOPE Scholarship during the first seven years after they graduate from high school or attain their GED. Student must be a final HOPE Scholar from an eligible high school or have maintained a "B" average after the college semester in which you have attempted 30 semester hours of degree credit. Applicants must not have earned a bachelor's degree or have attempted more than 127 semester hours of college credit. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent resident alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service.

ZELL MILLER SCHOLARSHIP

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Scholarship will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Scholarship requirements, student must have graduated from an eligible high school with a 3.7 GPA and an SAT score of 1200 or student must have graduated as a valedictorian or salutatorian while meeting all HOPE Scholarship eligibility requirements.

ZELL MILLER GRANT

Amount: The Zell Miller HOPE Grant will cover \$100 per semester hour for eligible students, \$132 per semester credit hour for Commercial Truck Driving, and \$230 per semester credit hour for Basic Law Enforcement.

Eligibility: In addition to meeting all HOPE Grant requirements, student have a minimum of 3.5 cumulative GPA in postsecondary classes. There is no high school GPA requirement. Students who earn a 3.5 or better at the end of their first semester will be eligible for the Zell Miller Grant their second semester. Students must maintain a minimum 3.5 GPA at the end of each subsequent semester to continue to qualify.

GEORGIA COLLEGE COMPLETION GRANT

Amount: The Georgia College Completion Grant will equal the outstanding balance of tuition/fees and dorm/cafeteria owed by the student.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the requirements to be classified as a Georgia resident according to the GSFC in-state tuition policies. A student must be enrolled as a credit student in an eligible program and maintain satisfactory academic progress. Also, the student cannot be in default of a Federal student loan and must be a U.S. Citizen or permanent residential alien. All males over the age of 18 must be registered with the Selective Service. Must be within 80% of earning their credential from the program they are enrolled in. Must have an outstanding balance for the term enrolled in and have exhausted all other financial aid opportunities. Must have high school diploma or GED. Must complete the 2023-2024 FAFSA. Lifetime maximum award is \$2500.

How to Apply for Admission to South Georgia Technical College

1. Submit a completed application, along with a one-time \$25 non-refundable application fee.
2. Provide official high school/GED/college transcript(s).
3. Provide proof of residency and picture ID.
4. Apply for Financial Aid (HOPE and Pell).
5. Receive acceptance letter and final instructions from SGTC Admissions Office.

*The placement exam is designed to determine the applicant's reading, writing and math skills in order to guide the student in educational and career decisions. It is not designed to be a hindrance or barrier to enrollment in a program. **Exceptions in lieu of the placement exam are:**
